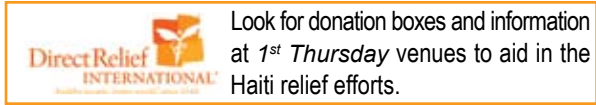




February 4th Passport

1. ARCHITECTURAL FOUNDATION GALLERY
229 East Victoria Street, entrance on Garden Street
Elegant Inspirations: Oil Paintings by Warner Nienow. Sublime renderings of beautifully lit interiors and exteriors in Santa Barbara and Los Angeles.

2. SULLIVAN GOSS - AN AMERICAN GALLERY
7 and 11 East Anapamu Street
Announcing three new shows opening for 1st Thursday. Works by American modernist Betty Lane and contemporary realist Martha Mayer Erlebacher will be on display. The gallery is also pleased to present their first showing of abstract paintings by contemporary painter Connie Connally.
